

Practicing English outside of the classroom: Listening

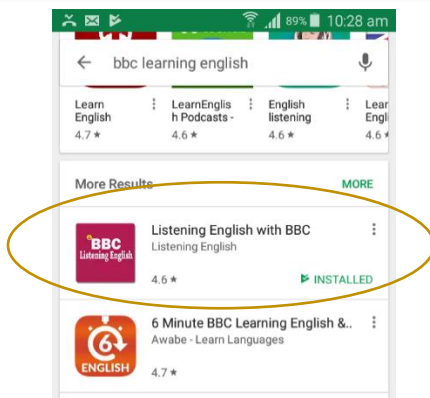
Learners often want to know where and how they can practice their English outside of the classroom.

Films, Tv, Netflix etc.

- Lots of students learn English by watching film and TV.
- Remember to use subtitles in Spanish or English, depending on your level.

With Ted.com, films, TV, Netflix etc, it is better for language learners to use subtitles. For all levels English audio is best if possible.

- For lower-levels (A1-B1), use Spanish subtitles with English audio.
- For higher-levels (B2+), use English subtitles with English audio.
