Academic Listening - Note-taking

Practice your note-taking by focusing on what's important. To do this, you need to understand what the person is talking about, and you do this by preparing for the lecture. This activity helps you prepare for lectures

Task 1 Internal discussion questions:

- 1. What problems do you have with listening in English?
- 2. How can you overcome these problems?
- 3. In what ways might lectures be easier/more difficult than general conversation?
- 4. What is the purpose of a lecture?



Preparation for lectures

A good student will NEVER enter a lecture cold. Reading should be completed **BEFORE** a lecture. The lecture should consolidate what you have read and answer any questions your reading brought up.

Note-taking during lectures (1)

Task 2: Decide if you agree or disagree with the following:

- a) It's impossible to listen effectively if you're taking notes at the same time.
- b) I like to take notes in my own language and translate later.
- c) I try to write everything down.
- d) I use abbreviations whenever I can.
- e) I always review my notes after the lecture.
