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## Below is a brief guide of the procedure, and how to describe and interpret the visual you are presenting.

1) Procedure:
2) First, everyone must understand what your graph illustrates. Explain the structure of your visuals (in diagrams, e.g. the axes, color codes and indications of size, in charts the titles of your columns etc.)
3) Then you can describe the data. "As we can see....
4) Then your next step (interpretation): "These figures suggest that ..."
5) Don't forget to present the source of your facts, directly on the slide
